Wild cherries, sloes and spice on a gorgeous nose that leads seamlessly to a rich and savoury palate. Harmonious, poised and with lovely energy and drive, a little touch of licquorice adds further complexity in a wild and sweeping finale. Drink from 2013.

93 points (Allen Meadows' Burghound Issue 30 - tasted 01 April 2008) - This is perhaps the most reserved wine in the range aromatically and it required aggressive swirling to coax even grudging aromas of red and blue pinot fruit with violet hints that precede ripe, pure and very serious broad-shouldered flavors that possess a beguiling texture and impressive mid-palate concentration that still does not completely buffer the firm, long and chewy finish. About the producer

Founded in 1731 in Beaune by Michel Bouchard, Bouchard Père & Fils $_7$ is one of the oldest wine estates in Burgundy, perpetuating tradition for nearly 3 centuries and 9 generations. This desire to build up an exceptional estate in Côte d'Or endured through the generations and acquisitions in the best Villages were added throughout the 19th century and again in the early 20th century. Today the estate boasts 130 hectares of vines, of which 12 are classed Grand Cru and 74 classed as Premier Cru. Combining tradition and innovation, Bouchard Père & Fils works hard to bring out the distinctiveness of each successive vineyard and vintage, striving to make its wines exquisite works of art, each with its own personality and charm.
