From younger vines, the straw-yellow colored 2010 Vouvray Pétillant Brut offers a very clear and delicate, yet concentrated and chalky flavored bouquet of stone fruits, quinces and lemon. Round, light and refined on the palate, this is a deliciously fruity, well-structured and very satisfying sparkling wine with a good length and a nicely chalky texture. A serious Prosecco killer.
